# Roadside Memorials



We respect your feelings

Main Roads respects the need for people to erect roadside memorials on Western Australian roads.

Sometimes, family and friends choose to honour their memories by placing a roadside memorial near the place where they died.

Our Policy and Guidelines for Roadside Memorials document outlines the process and can be found on our website. We can provide support to family and friends by assisting them to understand requirements and/or assist in the installation of a suitable roadside memorials at the safest location.

Main Roads foremost concern is that all road users are provided with a safe road environment and that family and friends and the road user are safe whilst a roadside memorial is being erected, visited or is being maintained.

We provide advice to family and friends on appropriate free roadside memorials, which include:



**A white, wooden cross**



**A grey, concrete paver, with a painted white cross**



**A decal (adhesive label) with a white cross on a black background**



**A plant**
